Tyalgum's own Mic Julien has been named Tweed Shire Council's 2024 Citizen of the Year, recognized for his outstanding contributions to the village and its people. The award was presented at Council's Australia Day ceremony at the Murwillumbah Civic Centre on Friday 24th January, a fitting acknowledgment of Mic's tireless dedication to making Tyalgum a better, safer, and more connected place to live.

Mic has been a familiar face in Tyalgum for over 11 years, always ready to lend his time and expertise to causes that matter. Whether as Chairperson of the Tyalgum Recreation Reserve, where he's overseen improvements to the land and, or in his role with the Tyalgum District Community Association, securing grants for essential infrastructure like the new radio repeater station, Mic has consistently put the community first.

Following the New Year's Day floods in 2024, Mic took on the leadership of Tyalgum's Community Resilience Group, strengthening the village's preparedness for future emergencies. SPTC has earned this honor for their sustained efforts to foster unity, resilience, and cultural pride through immersive Shakespearean productions that engage and uplift the community.

Tweed Mayor Chris Cherry praised their profound impact on the region -

Not only do the productions unite the community, they also provide an incredible entertainment experience unmatched across the Shire and draw in tourists and theatre lovers alike, bringing great economic benefit to the region."

Since 2015, Shepherd's Purse has captivated audiences with their innovative dinner theatre experiences, transforming local spaces like Flutterbies Cottage Café into enchanting open-air stages. One of the company's most notable achievements was securing the NSW premiere of Shakespeare in Love in 2023, a milestone that brought national attention to their work. The award was presented by NSW State Member Janelle Saffin on Saturday 7th December at Flutterbies Cafe, who commended the company for their unwavering dedication to enriching the community through the arts.

In a landmark achievement, it is believed that Shepherd's Purse Theatre Company is the first theatre company in New South Wales to be awarded the NSW Government Community Service Award. This recognition underscores the vital role of the arts in fostering community resilience, cultural pride, and social cohesion, placing Shepherds Purse alongside other distinguished recipients whose contributions have significantly enhanced the quality of life in their communities.



Tyalgum Recreation Reserve & Campground News

Mic Julien, President, Tyalgum Recreation Reserve

Xmas and New Year were busy periods at the camping ground even though the rain caused some cancellations. Our caretakers are doing a terrific job and we continue to get very positive feedback. The new drainage in the south-eastern corner has permitted camping in that area for most of the holidays.

We are now in the process of linking our four rainwater tanks to the amenities block, providing access to over 90,000 L of water. That water will be piped to the showers, toilets and basin after it has been filtered. This will reduce our dependency on Tyalgum village water and reduce our water costs. The kitchen remains on village water at present. The fence along Tyalgum Road and Coodgie Street (bridge to bridge) was completed just before Xmas. Thanks to Kaleb Talery for a great job. It's a big improvement to the entrance to Tyalgum. We are looking forward to a great 2025 in Tyalgum.

Tyalgum RFS Brigade News

Recent activity: - The wet weather has continued and there have been no fire incidents since our last report. This has made for a relaxing Christmas but training will soon recommence and maintenance is always happening. Here comes another one! A thunderstorm approaches Tyalgum from the southwest on 16 January. The gauge at Bartrim's Bridge

recorded 22mm in a very short time, with some small hail. At Kingscliff a house fire caused by an electrical fault was controlled promptly and the house was saved.

Fire outlook and advice: - The thunderstorms have been relentless and, if anything, are increasing in their intensity. There have been no cyclones yet, but that season is approaching. Given our saturated landscape we should be considering the possibility of flood rather than fire. Do you have a flood emergency plan? Long-time residents will have this down pat but newcomers should take the time to consider what preparations they might make. If your property is at risk of flooding then special preparations like moving goods, vehicles and livestock to safer locations will be necessary. Exactly what to move and to where is probably the first step of your plan. Evacuation will be the next. Where will you go and what will you take? Decide when you should leave and don't leave it until you can't get out.

Those of us above a possible flood probably just need to have adequate supplies for a few days and stay put until roads are passable. However, bear in mind that there has been an increase in "flash flooding" and "surface water flooding". Flash flooding occurs after torrential rain when water from above flows "cross country" and affects the area below. Surface water flooding happens when the normal drainage system is overwhelmed and water backs up. Over 20% of properties in our federal electorate of Richmond will be uninsurable by 2030 due to flood or fire risk, according to a recent report. In Los Angeles thousands of homeowners had their insurance policies cancelled before the devastating fires and many could not find affordable new cover before disaster struck.

The coming months are also the hottest of the year. Heatwaves are a very serious health risk. How will you keep people and animals safe, even if the power fails? If water is available a spray misting system may help.

Fire Permits are still required. The Fire Danger Period may be ended early, as happened last year, but this has not been made official. To obtain a Fire Permit ring 1300 632 174.

<u>Call for Volunteers:</u> New members are always welcome. The Brigade meets at the shed at 6pm on the 1st Friday of every even-numbered month. Our training day is the following Sunday, whether there is a meeting or not.

For all existing members we will be going through the process of membership renewals so look out for your email or text to make sure you are still a current member.


