It's Bush Fire Season!

Fire Permits are now required.

Our Bush Fire Danger Period began on 1 September and usually ends on 31 March.

To obtain a Fire Permit ring 1300 632 174.

Recent activity:

An ATV "buggy" rolled over and trapped the driver on Brays Creek Road in early August. Police, ambulance, VRA, RFS, SES and Fire and Rescue all responded. Two VRA units used their special gear to stabilise the vehicle and it took some time to extricate the driver and carry him safely to an ambulance.

Neighbours reported a fire in the Bald Mountain area on 2 September. Chillingham, Tyalgum and Murwillumbah RFS vehicles attended and the fire was extinguished.

Extensive Hazard reduction burns in Queensland in early September generated lots of smoke. Some of this was blown into the caldera and was heavy at times.

There were 2 reports of "Smoke in vicinity" during this period. These calls have to be investigated, even when we are confident that there is no local fire. You can improve your awareness of the fire situation by using the "Hazards Near Me NSW" app. This includes information from the older "Fires Near Me" app.

Light rain in the second week of September has ended the Queensland burning and cleared the air. Warmer and drier weather is expected Spring is the dangerous time is this area and now is the time to be prepared and attentive to conditions.



News from the Tyalgum Recreation Reserve Managers
The campground has been busy with a full house over the
Pub's Country Festival weekend, and plenty of campers every
weekend. Amy, Josh, and Leigh are doing an excellent job of
fitting campers in and making sure that they are well looked
after.

The campground continues to rate very highly on HICAMPS and that high rating keeps us near the top of that app's listings. We will meet with contractors later this month to go over the works that will start on 14th October to drain the south-east corner and distribute power and water to additional sites. That section of the grounds will be closed for some weeks.

The Managers are currently visiting the various Crown Lands that we look after to assess maintenance needs and potential improvements. This will help direct applications for grants. The Crown Lands that we look after include, the Hall and paddock at Bray's Creek, the paddock with horses on the corner of Tyalgum Road and Coodgie Street in Tyalgum, the paddocks opposite the General Store, the Bruce Bartrim Oval, the Campground, and the paddocks to the creek behind the campground.

Vote counting for the Tweed Shire Council election is underway after residents headed to the polls on Saturday. The final results are expected to be declared between 1 and 3 October, with postal votes continuing to be accepted until 6 pm on Friday 27 September.

Officials from the NSW Electoral Commission, which manages the election for most councils across the State, will continue counting over the coming days. Progressive tallies are available on the Commission's website.

Tweed Shire Council General Manager Troy Green thanked the community for their participation in the election. "We're pleased the election process has run smoothly and look forward to working with the newly elected Councillors," Mr Green said. "I'd like to acknowledge all candidates for putting

"I'd like to acknowledge all candidates for putting themselves forward to serve in civic office. I would also like to thank their supporters who assisted them with their respective campaigns."

A total of 45 candidates contested the 7 Councillor positions in the Tweed Shire.

Once results are declared, an Extraordinary Meeting of the new Council will be held on Tuesday 10 October for Councillors to take the oath or affirmation of office and elect the Mayor and Deputy Mayor.

Councillors will also undertake an induction program designed to prepare them for their roles during the 4-year term, in line with guidelines from the Office of Local Government.

Local Pest: Cat's Claw Creeper

Cat's claw creeper is a perennial woody vine that:

- forms dense mats that smother and outcompete native ground covers and seedlings
- · climbs over shrubs and trees restricting growth or killing them
- can cause branches and whole trees to fall from the weight of the vines
- changes water flow when trees fall into waterways
- can create gaps in the canopy changing conditions for forest plants
- · reduces food and shelter for native animals
- can damage infrastructure such as fences and sheds.

Cat's claw creeper is listed as a Key Threatening Process in NSW because of its potential to impact on endangered and vulnerable plants as well as Lowland Subtropical Rainforest, which is an Endangered Ecological Community.

Cat's claw creeper grows in coastal areas of NSW north of Sydney.

It is native to Central and South America and the West Indies.

Cat's claw creeper grows in subtropical, tropical and warm moist temperate climates. It can tolerate both heavy shade and full sun. It grows in a range of soil types but does not tolerate waterlogging. Plants can tolerate heavy frosts, drought conditions and saline soils. It grows:

- in rainforests, eucalypt forests and woodlands
- along waterways in coastal and hinterland areas
- in disturbed areas such as roadsides and occasionally gardens.

Seed pods mature in late summer to autumn and seeds start dropping from the vines in late May. Most seeds fall in July and August. Seed viability is low but seed production is high and some seeds produce multiple seedlings. The seeds germinate best when covered by moist leaf litter rather than buried in soil. The winged seeds can be blown in the wind

and spread by water along streams and rivers.

Established plants can reproduce from tubers and stems. Roots develop tubers in their second year. Detached tubers and stems sprout in moist conditions. The tubers can be spread in flood waters or by machinery if the soil is disturbed.


